## **COLONEL TRAUNA "TJ" L. JAMES**

Colonel James is currently the Military Deputy Director of the Software Directorate at the Air Force Sustainment Center. In this role, she provides senior principal oversight to stand up AFSC's newly established Software Directorate (AFSC/SW) to accelerate the Department of the Air Force's (DAF) software mission, providing technological capacity and capability to the warfighter across the 21<sup>st</sup> century battlefield. Under AFSC/SW, she oversees the realignment of AFSC's Software Engineering Groups of 5,000+ USAF software developers allocated across three primary locations: 76 SWEG (Tinker), 309 SWEG (Hill), and 402 SWEG (Robins) from the respective Air Logistic Complexes to AFSC/SW. These organizations collectively provide ~\$1B organic software services for DAF weapon systems and equipment, for all echelons of development and sustainment to ensure mission capability readiness. In addition, she directs the charge to develop the processes and procedures to provide customers a single interface for all software workload and to integrate software teams leveraging resources across the larger DAF enterprise to deliver an integrated software ecosystem.



Colonel James grew up in Montgomery, Alabama. She earned her commission in 1995 from the United States Air Force Academy where she also performed as a member of the "Flight of Sound," the U.S. Air Force Academy Cadet Drum and Bugle Corps. A career acquisition officer, her assignments include program management at the Subsystems System Program Office, the ICBM System Program Office, the Mature and Proven Aircraft Directorate, and the Military Satellite Communications (MILSATCOM) Joint Program Office. She also served as a Program Element Monitor for the MILSATCOM Terminals and the C-17 weapon system before serving as Materiel Leader, B-52 Modernization and Sustainment Program. This assignment was the spring board to serving as the AFLCMC HQ Section Commander responsible for executing commander's personnel programs and command authority for AFLCMC acquisition, functional, and staff directorates across 77 locations worldwide. From there, she catapulted into serving as the Chief, USAF F-35A Fleet Management Office (FMO), where she led the 3-star directed United States Air Force (USAF) F-35A FMO startup designed to support USAF F-35A readiness and deployment requirements, provide direct and agile support to the warfighter, provide solutions to warfighter challenges, minimize negative warfighter impacts, and inform effective acquisition solutions to meet warfighter requirements. Then her leadership and acumen steered her into the Acting Deputy Director for Logistics and Logistics Services Directorate and the Chief, Enterprise Management Division, Logistics and Logistics Services Directorate, Air Force Life Cycle Management Center (AFLCMC), Air Force Materiel Command (AFMC), Wright-Patterson Air Force Base (WPAFB), Ohio. She provided program and resource support to the Program Executive Officers and their more than 400 Acquisition Category programs, numerous sustainment programs and a workforce of over 4,000 life cycle logisticians. In addition, Col James led a team of 32 logisticians and operations analysts producing quarterly 4-star readiness of combat capability executive reviews and fleet-wide data analytics to improve mission capability. Furthermore, she was the AFLCMC O-6 representative to HAF/A4 enterprise log forums; ensured that product support was integrated into plans and concepts; and directed Center planning for \$5B/yr. demand signal to AFMC's Requirements Review/Depot Determination process.

Prior to her current position, Colonel James was the Deputy Director of the Plans and Programs Directorate at the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center. In this role, she served as the Staff 2-letter director that led a 204-member integrated team to organize, train, equip AF's largest acquisition Center--26K personnel/9 major locations. She oversaw strategic planning/governance process, Information Technology/Facility management, Operations Research Analysis; supports ~800+ acquisition programs. Finally, she developed Center planning choices, advocated for \$4.2B planned needs for the next 5 years; energized digital transformation initiatives.
